Because of time constraints, games in the National League have been lasting only 5 or 6 innings. Therefore, beginning on November 7th, batters will start with one ball and one strike counts to speed up the games. This does not apply to the American league.

National League Will Go to 3 or 4 Drafts

There will be at least 3, and possibly 4 drafts as opposed to the usual 2 from the October through April seasons. This results from favorable feed-back during the summer season. The 2nd rearrangement of teams will begin play on Tuesday, 11/28, after Thanksgiving. All the players get to know many other players with this frequent changing of teams. This does not apply to the American league.

How's About a Higher Fence at the SCW Field?

The SCW club is negotiating with the Rec Center Board to increase the vertical height of the field by raising the fence to 12 feet from foul line to foul line. This would mean fewer homers.
